2014 Hikes & Walks Report



he EACTN hikes and walks 2014 season is almost over, with 12 events originally scheduled starting early May and ending mid-October. We are expecting to end the year at well over 120 person-events, which is somewhat lower than 2013.

Like our golf colleagues, we were impacted by poor weather and rain this season. We had to cancel 3 events, primarily because of weather, but also for lack of interest.

The organizers have scheduled these events every other week, alternating short urban walks on Thursdays with longer, more challenging hikes outside the city on Wednesdays, in the hope of accommodating and drawing as many potential participants as possible. This year we included 2 news hikes in the Oak Ridges Moraine area which were well attended. Another new hike around the Royal Botanical Gardens near Hamilton had to be cancelled.

As in previous years, these events have given us the opportunity to explore areas in and around the city that would otherwise remain unknown to the majority of us. We also tried a few new restaurants.

Again this year, and by far the most popular (and oversubscribed) event was the walking tour guided by our own Jim Arnott. Jim planned the walk to follow as much as possible an old native trail along Davenport Rd. The walk ended at the Brickworks with a delicious lunch at the Belong Café. Jim did a fabulous job researching the history of the landmarks along the way and sharing his knowledge.

With our fifth hikes and walks season coming to a close, and in the spirit of Continuous Improvement, we will incorporate this year's learnings for the next season and – with new hiking areas to be proposed – we hope to see more of you on the trails next year.
